Incoming Kindergarten Scholar Summer Homework 2020 – 2021

Welcome Parents of Future Kindergarten Superstars!

We are so excited you have decided to join the BWLS Ascend Family and are looking forward to a powerful year ahead. Kindergarten truly is a **foundational** year. It is a critical grade in setting your child up for future social and academic success. By the end of Kindergarten, readers must be reading independently and be able to talk about what they have just discovered from reading the book. By the end of the year, mathematicians must be able to count based on place value and be able to solve many different problem types.

With this in mind, in order to start the Kindergarten year off strong, scholars should have **mastered** a few academic skills **before** we begin school in September. Below are the academic skills an entering Kindergarten scholar needs.

In order for your child to have a successful year ahead in KG literacy (reading) they should:

- 1. Be able to identify rhyming words by sound. For example, dog, log, and frog all "sound the same", in other words they rhyme. (no materials necessary, all practiced out loud)
- 2. Be able to identify words that begin with the same sound. For example, bed, bat and ball all begin with the same sound, /b/. (no materials necessary, all practiced out loud)
- 3. Be able to break a word apart into its individual sounds. For example, the word "cat" when said slowly is c/a/t. (no materials necessary, all practiced out loud)
- 4. Be able to write their first and last name and be able to identify letters in their name. For example, they should be able to tell you what the first or last letter in their name is.

 (lined paper is attached to practice writing both first and last name)

In order for your child to have a successful year ahead in **KG math** they should:

- 1. Know how to write the numbers 0 through 9 (use attached worksheets)
- 2. Be able to count a set of objects up to 5 and recognize that one object represents one number. To practice, give your child a collection of 5 household items and encourage them to count out loud by touching the item and then saying the number. You can also help your child by encouraging them to put objects in a straight line before counting.

Summer is the perfect time to master these much-needed skills and to begin working on other early Kindergarten learning in both reading and math. Attached you will find a summer work packet that will prepare scholars for a strong start to this foundational year of learning. Again, we are so happy to be partners in learning!

We look forward to our year in Kindergarten!

¡Bienvenidos Padres de las Futuras Superestrellas del Jardín de Infantes!

Estamos tan entusiasmados que han decidido unirse a la Familia de BWLS Ascend y anticipamos un año entrante poderoso. El Jardín de Infantes es un año verdaderamente **fundamental.** Es un grado crítico para preparar a su hijo para el éxito social y académico. Para el final del Jardín de Infantes, lectores deben leer independientemente y poder hablar de lo que acaban de descubrir al leer el libro. Para el final del año, matemáticos deben poder contar basado en valor posicional y poder resolver muchos diferentes tipos de problemas.

Con esto en mente, para poder comenzar el año escolar del Jardín de Infantes de manera fuerte, estudiantes deben haber **dominado** varias destrezas académicas **antes** de que comencemos el año escolar en septiembre. A continuación verán las destrezas académicas que cada estudiante entrante al Jardín de Infantes necesita habar dominado.

Para que su hijo tenga un año exitoso en la Alfabetización de Jardín de Infantes, debe:

- 1. Poder identificar palabras que riman basado en sus sonidos. Por ejemplo, *dog*, *log*, y *frog* todas <suenan iguales>, o en otras palabras, riman. (No se requiere de materiales, se puede practicar en voz alta)
- 2. Poder identificar palabras que comienzan con el mismo sonido. Por ejemplo, *bed, bat* y *ball* todas comienzan con el mismo sonido, /b/. (No se requiere de materiales, se puede practicar en voz alta)
- 3. Poder partir una palabra en sus sonidos individuales. Por ejemplo, la palabra <cat> cuando dicha lentamente es /c/ /a/ /t/. (No se requiere de materiales, se puede practicar en voz alta)
- 4. Poder escribir su nombre y apellido y poder identificar las letras de su nombre. Por ejemplo, debe poder decirle cual es la primera o última letra de su nombre (adjunto verá una hoja de papel con líneas para que practique la escritura del nombre y apellido)

Para que su hijo tenga un año exitoso en las Matemáticas de Jardín de Infantes, debe:

- 1. Poder escribir los números 0 a 9 (use hojas de práctica adjuntas)
- 2. Poder contar un conjunto de objetos hasta 5 y reconocer que un objeto representa un número. Para practicar, dé a su hijo una colección de 5 artículos de la casa y anímelo a contar en voz alta al tocar cada artículo y luego decir el número. También puede ayudar a su hijo al animarlo a poner los objetos en una línea recta antes de contarlos.

El verano es un tiempo perfecto para dominar estas destrezas necesarias y para comenzar a trabajar en otras oportunidades de aprendizaje para el Jardín de Infantes en tanto la lectura como las matemáticas. Adjunto encontrará un paquete de trabajo de verano que les preparará a estudiantes para un comienzo fuerte para este año de aprendizaje fundamental. ¡De nuevo, estamos muy contentos de colaborar con ustedes en su aprendizaje!

In order to ensure that your child is ready to begin kindergarten this fall, we have created this booklet for you to help them prepare. Dedicating time with your child to complete this work will ensure that your child is truly ready for the academic rigor of an Ascend charter school. The booklet is divided into two sections that cover the skills your child must practice over the summer: School Readiness Behaviors and Academic Homework. The School Readiness Behaviors section can be taught at any time but should be mastered by the first day of school. The Academic Homework section is divided into weekly packets and should be completed daily. In addition to the worksheets to practice handwriting, phonics and math that are included in each packet, please be sure to read with your scholar for at least 15 minutes per day. Remember to sign the reading log to track your progress.

We recommend that you do all of the following to be sure that the work is completed as required:

- 1) Identify a specific time in the day when this work will be consistently done.
- 2) Identify and train the person who will be overseeing this work. It should be one adult.
- 3) Be sure that the written practice work is done in a quiet area that will eventually become the child's homework spot during the school year. This space should be quiet and free of food, drink and TV.

School Readiness Behaviors: The following behaviors must be taught and reinforced by the parents over the summer. A checklist is attached to this letter to help you track which behaviors have been successfully mastered and which ones have not. This checklist will also help teachers recognize areas of growth for your scholar when it is turned in on the first day of school.

• Tie his/her shoes by themselves.	• Respond verbally to questions in complete sentences.	 Fasten and unfasten buttons, hooks and clasps. 			
• Fasten and unfasten belts.	• Tuck in shirts all the way around.	• State and write his/her first and last name, clearly.			
• State parents' names and at least one phone number.	• Recognize the moment when they feel the urge to go to the bathroom and notify an adult. Scholars cannot wait until the very last moment (when they are about to have an accident) to notify an adult.	• Use the bathroom, flush the toilet, and wash his/her hands without any assistance.			

Academic Homework: The homework packet for each week must be completed daily, using the packet's cover sheet as a guide. Your scholar must also read a children's book with an adult for at least 15 minutes per day. The adult must also lead a discussion with your scholar about the book, using the guiding questions included on the cover sheet for each week. Be sure to log your reading every day to track your progress.

All of the Academic Homework packets from each week and the School Readiness Behaviors checklist should be completed and handed in to your scholar's kindergarten teacher on the first day of school.

During scholar orientation, we will administer an assessment to all scholars who are new to their Ascend charter school. This assessment will be used to show the teachers what the scholar already knows in both English and math. This will also help us evaluate our own performance as a school at the end of the year by showing us how much our instruction has helped your child to grow academically. In a few rare instances, we may find that your child is ready for the academic rigor of first grade. If we find that this is the case, we will call you in to the school for a meeting to discuss the possibility of moving your child into the first grade.

We hope you enjoy your summer and look forward to meeting your scholar soon!

School Readiness Behaviors

O Tie his or her own shoes.
O Respond orally to questions in complete sentences. (Example: "What is your name?" Answer: "My name is Joe Smith" instead of "Joe")
O Fasten and unfasten buttons, hooks and clasps on his/her shirt and pants.
O Fasten and unfasten his/her belt.
O Tuck in shirts into pants or skirts all the way around.
O Say and write his/her own first and last name, clearly.
O Say parents' names and at least one phone number.
O Recognize the moment he/she feels the urge to go to the bathroom and notify an adult. They cannot wait until the very last moment (when they are about to have an accident) to notify an adult.
O Use the bathroom without any assistance. Flush the toilet and wash hands with soap without any assistance.
